



By 2022, B.C.'s EPR programs will have the following benefits:

CANADA-WIDE ACTION PLAN FOR EPR (2009)

Provides all provinces and territories with a harmonized set of principles and a common schedule of products

Phase 1 (by 2015)

- Packaging and printed paper materials
- Electronics and electrical
- Mercury-containing products (including lamps)
- Household hazardous and special wastes
- Automotive products

Phase 2 (by 2017)

- Construction and demolition materials
- Furniture, textiles and carpet
- Appliances (including ODS)

PACKAGING AND PRINTED PAPER

Recycling Regulation amended in May 2011 to include Packaging and Printed Paper because:

- CCME Canada-wide Action Plan
- 16 UBCM resolutions
- Waste composition 20-30% PPP



EPR FOR THE BLUE BOX

BC will lead North America

- More materials accepted in the Blue Box province wide
- Increase diversion from landfill 52% to 75%
- Save \$80 100 M municipal taxpayer dollars / annually
- Reduction or elimination of unnecessary packaging
