#### Introduction



To advise how Vancity has and continues to reduce its environmental footprint through the incorporation of the principles of environmental sustainability in all aspects of its operations.

### A History of Being Socially & Environmentally Responsible

- Chose to build housing for low income families as part of two owned branch structures
- Largest organization in Canada to adopt the Living Wage policy
- First master planned development (Dockside Green) to target LEED® (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design)
  Platinum certification
- Vancity achieves carbon neutrality; a first for a North Americanbased financial institution.
- Vancity is the first to offer a loan and a preferred rate for the purchase of a low CO<sub>2</sub> emission vehicle – Clean Air Auto Loan.
- Bright Ideas Home Financing was introduced for energy efficient home renovations – the first in Canada.
- Vancity launches the first Lower Mainland bike sharing initiative.

### Vancity approach to building design and operation



- Vancity advocates socially and environmentally responsible practices
- Creates policies to involve staff, members and our surrounding communities
- Strives to effect strong neighbourhood ties utilizing a high degree of eco-effectiveness

### **Present and Future Improvements**



- For all products used by the operation, the environmental aspects of the options available are factored into (in a material and quantitative manner) our purchasing decisions
- In 1995, the head office building for Vancity (Vancity Centre) had built in paper, glass, metal, plastic recycling bins on every floor at the coffee stations; this approach has been incorporated into all of our branches for glass, metal, paper and plastic.
- We have introduced composting at 80% of the branches and 14 of our branches are now zero waste with a plan to add 10 more in 2015
- All wood used on construction projects is FSC certified
- Carpet tile flooring uses natural fibres and a portion of recycled content and/or is completely recyclable

## Present and Future Improvements continued



- Engineered hardwood (rather than laminate) is used for flooring and reclaimed wood furniture is also used
- Natural light, excellent indoor air quality (measured proactively on a regular basis) and ergonomic stations are provided for all employees
- Commuting now represents the largest percentage of Vancity's GHG emissions - there are incremental programs in development to reduce GHG from this source
- Continuous Energy Management Program since 1991
- Vancity have been measuring GHG emissions since 1991 this was originally done for energy use only through the Voluntary Climate Registry. Today we leverage the GRI system (the international standard) to measure GHG – and our results are audited annually.
