First Nations Responders Inc. seeks to address one of the key problems, the lack of trained people in the work force, and the chronic under employment of First Nations young people, the largest and fastest growing population group in the province.

WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

Major Energy and other Natural Resource developments are underway or planned for British Columbia.

For far too long First Nations have not shared fully in the benefits from such development.







WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

Many of these developments will affect First Nations lands, waters, communities and cultural heritage.

The risks to the environment and to the vital interests of First Nations are High – Too High to be ignored.







WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

Environmental Emergencies can happen anywhere at anytime – often in remote locations.

First Nations residents are often the closest to such emergencies and stand to lose the most.





WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

They must be trained to recognize the risks involved and to respond quickly and safely.

First Nations Responders can provide the training needed to ensure human safety and to protect the environment.





WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

- Emergency safety is an extension of good governance and stewardship
- Creates regional nodes of trained responders
- Emergency preparedness adds value to environmental monitoring, and land management.
- Increases credibility of the community
